Defining an Investment Universe

Is this a renewable energy strategy?

No. While renewable energy is an important component, the strategy focuses more broadly on energy resilience—which extends beyond renewables to include technologies such as natural gas, hydrogen, and nuclear. We take a holistic approach, seeking long-term investment opportunities across a diversified and evolving energy landscape.

What is the GICS sector exposure?

The thematic portfolio is primarily focused on select sectors that are deemed either direct drivers or indirect contributors to the Energy Transition. This includes Energy, Materials, Industrials, Utilities Real Estate, and Financials, as well as Technology companies and related industries.

What can I expect from the final portfolio?

The final portfolio is expected to hold approximately 45–60 large- and mid-cap U.S. equities. The strategy intends to maintain a value-oriented bias and is benchmarked against the Russell 1000 Index.
