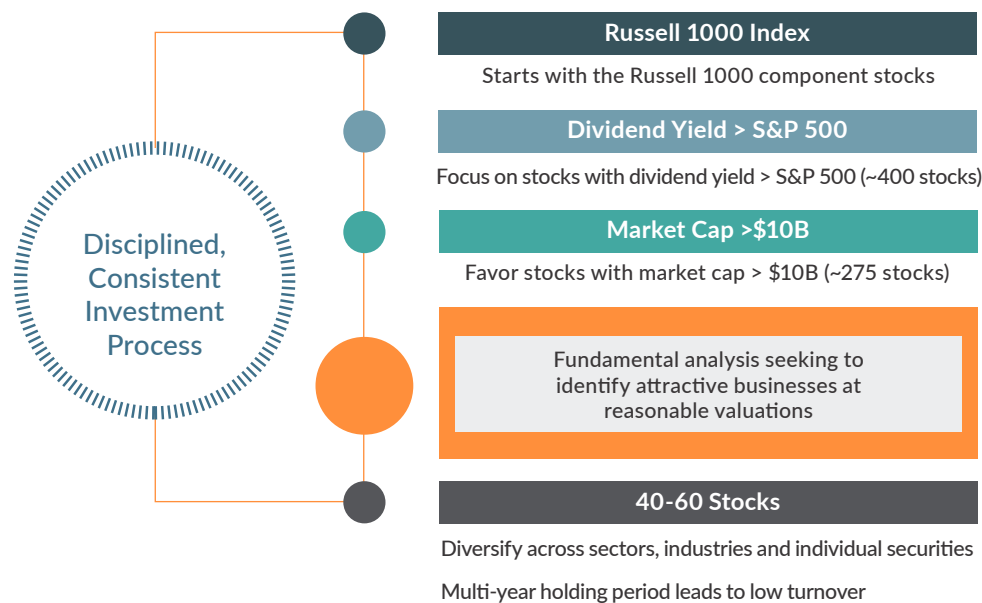

Excess Return: amount that returns exceed relative benchmark return. **Dividend Yield:** the annual dividend payment expressed as a percentage of a stock's current price, showing the return an investor can expect from dividends alone. **Weighted Average Market Cap:** total value of all outstanding shares weighted to reflect the portfolio's positions. **Price to Earnings (P/E):** ratio of stock price to earnings. **Price to Book (P/B):** ratio of stock price to per share shareholders' equity. **Return on Equity (ROE):** net income divided by equity. **3-Year EPS Growth:** annualized historical earnings per share growth over the last 3 years. EPS Growth is not a forecast of the fund's future performance. **Sharpe Ratio:** sharpe ratio is a simple measurement of the risk-adjusted performance. **Tracking Error:** measures the active risk of the portfolio and the annualized standard deviation of the excess returns between the portfolio and its benchmark. **Standard Deviation:** measures dispersion of a set of data from its mean. **Beta:** systematic risk of a portfolio; represents sensitivity to the benchmark. The Russell 1000 Index is an unmanaged, market-capitalization-weighted total return index comprised of the largest 1,000 companies in the Russell 3000 Index. The S&P 500 Index consists of 500 widely held common stocks. This unmanaged index is a total return index with dividends reinvested. The Russell 1000 Value Index is an unmanaged, market value weighted index, which measures the performance of those 1,000 largest companies in the Russell 3000 Index with lower price-to-book ratios and lower forecasted growth values. **One cannot invest directly in an index.
