

Excess Return: amount that returns exceed relative benchmark return. Weighted Average Market Cap: total value of all outstanding shares weighted to reflect the portfolio's positions. Price to Earnings (P/E): ratio of stock price to earnings. Price to Book (P/B): ratio of stock price to per share shareholders' equity. Return on Equity (ROE): net income divided by equity. 5-Year EPS Growth: annualized historical earnings per share growth over the last 5 years. EPS Growth is not a forecast of the fund's future performance. Active Share: measures the percentage of stock holdings in a manager's portfolio that differs from the benchmark index. Sharpe Ratio: sharpe ratio is a simple measurement of the risk-adjusted performance. Tracking Error: measures the active risk of the portfolio and the annualized standard deviation of the excess returns between the portfolio and its benchmark. Standard Deviation: measures dispersion of a set of data from its mean. Beta: systematic risk of a portfolio; represents sensitivity to the benchmark. The Russell 1000 Index is an unmanaged, market-capitalization-weighted total return index comprised of the largest 1,000 companies in the Russell 3000 Index. This unmanaged index is a total return index with dividends reinvested. One cannot invest directly in an index. The Morningstar Rating™ for funds, or "star rating", is calculated for managed products (including mutual funds, variable annuity and variable life subaccounts, exchange-traded funds, closed-end funds, and separate accounts) with at least a three-year history, without adjustment for sales loads. Exchange-traded funds and open-ended mutual funds are considered a single population for comparative purposes. It is calculated based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a managed product's monthly excess performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. The top 10% of products in each product category receive 5 stars, the next 22.5% receive 4 stars, the next 35% receive 3 stars, the next 22.5% receive 2 stars, and the bottom 10% receive 1 star. The Overall Morningstar Rating™ for a managed product is derived from a weighted average of the performance figures associated with its three-, five-, and 10-year (if applicable) Morningstar Rating™ metrics. The weights are: 100% three-year rating for 36-59 months of total returns, 60% five-year rating/40% three-year rating for 60-119 months of total returns, and 50% 10-year rating/30% five-year rating/20% three-year rating for 120 or more months of total returns. While the 10-year overall star rating formula seems to give the most weight to the 10-year period, the most recent three-year period actually has the greatest impact because it is included in all three rating periods. © 2025 Morningstar, Inc.
