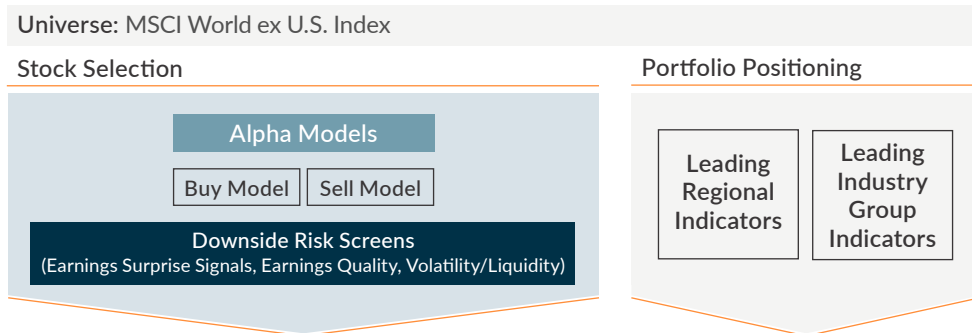

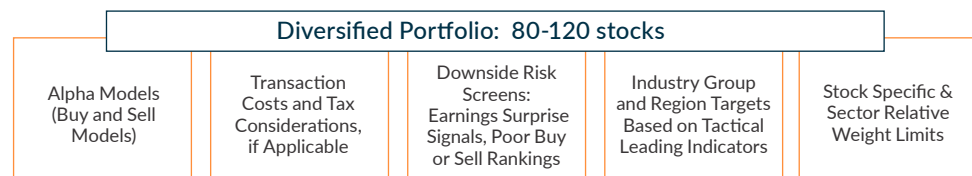

Excess Return: amount that returns exceed relative benchmark return. **Alpha:** a measure of an investment's ability to generate returns above a benchmark, reflecting the value added by active management. **Weighted Average Market Cap:** total value of all outstanding shares weighted to reflect the portfolio's positions. **Price to Earnings (P/E):** ratio of stock price to earnings. **Price to Book (P/B):** ratio of stock price to per share shareholders' equity. **Return on Equity (ROE):** net income divided by equity. **5-Year EPS Growth:** annualized historical earnings per share growth over the last 5 years. EPS Growth is not a forecast of the fund's future performance. **Active Share:** measures the percentage of stock holdings in a manager's portfolio that differs from the benchmark index. **Sharpe Ratio:** sharpe ratio is a simple measurement of the risk-adjusted performance. **Tracking Error:** measures the active risk of the portfolio and the annualized standard deviation of the excess returns between the portfolio and its benchmark. **Standard Deviation:** measures dispersion of a set of data from its mean. **Beta:** systematic risk of a portfolio; represents sensitivity to the benchmark. The weights are: 100% three-year rating for 36-59 months of total returns, 60% five-year rating/40% three-year rating for 60-119 months of total returns, and 50% 10-year rating/30% five-year rating/20% three-year rating for 120 or more months of total returns.
